


Voter Access Survey Results

1. Have you or anyone you know encountered a challenge or limitation that impacted your voting experience?

Of the 41 responses, 5 (12 percent) said they know someone or they themselves have encountered challenges or limitations that impacted their voting experience and 36 (87 percent) have not.




2. If yes, please share your experience.

Responses (printed verbatim)
Transportation issues in the past
Simple, mechanical, neighborhood polling locations -- which require only that a citizen show up on election day and cast a ballot are being replaced with numerous voting options that are dependent on human interaction (mail carriers, city employees, etc) that open the door for widespread voting fraud. My voting experience is adversely impacted as year after year, my hope for an honest process is further torn down by the constant bombardment from my local government actively skewing election results in their favor.
Last election I registered at the polling location. It too 45 minutes because no one appeared to know what to do.
Mobility issues requiring absentee ballots. Planning required. No limitations particular to Golden Valley.

After recently moving here, my wife and I registered to vote while at the DMV getting out licences. We received a letter from the Hennipin county stating that because of your late registration it would be necessary to have the letter they sent with us when voting on the primary. We went to our polling place and when attempting to vote were told the letter was not sufficient.

3. Are there any issues or concerns that might impact your participation in the voting process?

Of the 41 respondents, 9 (22 percent) said they have issues or concerns that might impact their participation in the voting process and 32 (78 percent) say they do not.



4. If so, what are they?

Responses (printed verbatim)
Voting by mail resolved my healthcare related concerns
My local government gerrymandering the voting process to always obtain the votes they desire to do whatever they wish.
I find the options confusing and not sure if my mail in ballot will be voided if I decide to go in person!
USPS slowness/slowdown and my ballot arriving on time to be counted.
I'm very concerned that my mail in ballot will reach you and be counted.

Safe and accessible polling locations. Keep them within their precinct whenever possible versus having to travel longer distance for those who want to vote in person.

Covid

Fear that Trump will lie, cheat and steal the election.

Concern re COVID exposure; glad to have the option of voting by mail.

Will be voting in person but wonder how confusing the verbiage/requirements for mail-in voting process is for folks.
